#### Calgary AIS Report and Request for Support

The purpose of Calgary Al-Anon Information Services (AIS) is to coordinate services for the more than 40 groups in the Calgary area. A key part of this service is to oversee and fund the 24-hour Al-Anon Information Line in Calgary, 403-266-5850. Calgary AIS has a contract with Big Sky Call Centres to provide this service, which usually handles about 50 Al-Anon calls per month. Big Sky provides callers with information about meetings, the provincial website and bookstore, and answers routine questions. When a caller requires more information than what can be provided by Big Sky, the caller is transferred to an Al-Anon member - a monitoring volunteer. Calgary AIS's contract is based on traditional call volumes. Call numbers higher than usual result in extra fees.

Since the beginning or the COVID-19 pandemic, calls to the Al-Anon phone line have increased dramatically. In July, Big Sky answered 193 calls for Al-Anon information. The high number of calls increased our billing to \$997 for July, up from the regular monthly fee of \$250. Calgary AlS is taking several steps to deal with the increased demand. At the AlS meeting held on September 14, we decided to change our monthly service from Big Sky to include more calls.

Please consider Calgary AIS for a timely donation from your group. We are an essential Al-Anon service arm, grateful for the financial support from groups and members in the Calgary area. With the increase in calls to Al-Anon during the pandemic, Calgary AIS provides a critical link to connect families and friends of alcoholics with Al-Anon meetings. The revised service plan means our monthly costs will be reduced, but the total cost of providing this essential phone service in 2020 is up. #### Calgary Alateen Update: September 2020

I am pleased to report that we have restarted one Alateen face to face meeting at Lakeview United Church on Monday evenings from 7:30 to 8:30 pm. Pal-Anon is looking at reopening face to face meetings starting October 5th.

We are observing continuous masking, 6' distancing, disinfecting of hands and surfaces before and after the meeting, and each person gets their own copy of "Groups at Work" to read from. The teens are required to share their first name and contact phone number with the designated Alateen Sponsor who will only share that information with Alberta Health Services should they need to do contact tracing. The teens are also expected to contact the sponsor, should they or someone close to them tests positive.

We have a small group of dedicated AMIAS's that are willing to keep these meetings going, providing the numbers warrant it, and the church does not end up having to shut down due to new city or provincial requirements. The church has been very supportive of our efforts, providing us with the first 3 weeks of meetings free. We have enough Alateen 7th tradition funds for the next 2 to 3 months. If things become busy but we end up struggling financially, we may request for some help from the Districts.

I listened to a disturbing CBC report a couple weeks ago saying that since the start of the pandemic, suicide has now surpassed motor vehicle accidents as the #1 cause of death in the 10 to 16 year old age range. These are tough times and they are not going to get any easier anytime soon, especially for kids that are stuck at home with active alcoholism. We aren't professional counsellors, but we can do our part and offer some hope and support where there is drinking issues in the family. If there are any teens that you know that you think could benefit from Alateen, now is the time to speak up.

There are also excellent resources for teens available at both the Area (<u>al-anon.ab.ca</u>) and World Service Office (<u>al-anon.org</u>) websites, including links to a variety of Alateen Chat lines, including our Alberta one.

Please help get the word out to fellow Al-Anon members, groups and even any AA contacts you think might be interested.

Hang in there everyone and take good care of yourselves. As I heard a Doctor say way back in March "We're not in for a marathon, we're in for an ultramarathon."
