#### **Celebrating 60 Years of Conference Approved Literature**

In April 1961, at Al-Anon's first World Service Conference, our Cofounder Lois W. introduced the idea of Conference Approved Literature (CAL). As Lois explained, it would serve the same purpose as the formation of the Conference—to create unity among all groups. Prior to that, groups often wrote and distributed their own literature or used various outside sources. Some of these materials were inconsistent with Al-Anon's Traditions and spiritual principles. They often took a religious approach or focused on trying to "cure" the alcoholic, therefore causing confusion about Al-Anon's identity and purpose.

The Conference's unanimous decision and the process it developed over the following years assured that our literature would reflect the Al-Anon program in principle and practice, undiluted by differing points of view. Over the years, CAL has continued to expand to meet new needs and changing conditions.

Within the last year and a half, as our fellowship and the World Service Office (WSO) faced the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, literature sales plummeted and *The Forum* lost 2,300 subscribers. An increase in contributions has helped counter this drop in sales, thanks to the generosity of Al-Anon members everywhere. For the first time since 1954 (the year before our first book was published), member contributions exceeded literature sales. While I am comforted by the idea that the fellowship will continue to support its service arms, I remain concerned about what we are losing in recovery as reliance on one of our primary tools continues to diminish.

Our literature can't substitute for the healing that takes place at Al-Anon meetings and in one-on-one conversations with Sponsors and other members, but it greatly supplements this help with inspirational insights from thousands of members—not only from throughout the world, but from throughout the history of our program. Between meetings and when other members are not available, CAL offers me the comfort of knowing that my problems are not unique, and I am not alone. When I am reluctant to share because I am afraid that no one will understand, CAL reassures me that others have been there too. If I feel different at a meeting because of my age, gender, relation to the alcoholic, or any other reason, CAL reminds me that we are all equal.

Our Suggested Welcome states, "The loving interchange of help among members and daily reading of Al-Anon/Alateen literature thus make us ready to receive the priceless gift of serenity." So please, in celebration of CAL's 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary, when anyone reaches for help, let's make sure that not only the hand of Al-Anon, but also the gift of Conference Approved Literature is always there, and "Let It Begin with Me."

#### In a Safe Place

I have not missed the irony that the same place where I dropped my daughter off for preschool 14 years ago is now the place where I attend Al-Anon meetings because of her drinking. I remember the first day I dropped her off at preschool. She was sobbing uncontrollably, and it pained me to leave her that way. I called my mom, crying. "I'm not sure why I am crying too," I said. She told me it was because I was entrusting my child to someone else's care.

My daughter cried every day at preschool drop-off for the first month. Leaving her that way was such a difficult thing to do, but I knew it was essential to her learning and growth. I also knew she was in a safe place. Eventually the tears stopped—both hers and mine—and instead of feeling the anguish of leaving her, I witnessed the excitement she had when I came to pick her up and she understood that I would always be waiting for her with open arms.

We are in a similar process now. It pains me to see her in her current condition, but I am entrusting her to my Higher Power's care. I know that it is essential, not only to *her* learning and growth, but also to *mine*. When she is ready and wants my help, I will be waiting for her with open arms. In the meantime, I will continue to attend Al-Anon meetings in the same building where my daughter went to preschool, because I know I am in a safe place.
