Placing Literature Orders from your Al-Anon Bookstore (LDC) and Paying by eTransfer

If customers want to pay for their order by an e-transfer when ordering online they can select Pay at the Store under payment method. The amount will include shipping if they are not picking up the order at the store. Below are step by step instructions to follow.

Website: www.al-anonbookstore.ca

If you have placed an order in the past log into your account with the email on file and your password. If this is your 1st order please go through the process of setting up an account and picking a password.

<u>Note</u>: If you are ordering literature for your group, please set up the account in the groups name. You can put your personal information in the Shipping Information section if you are not picking up the order from the store.

Do your shopping: picking the items you would like and quantities of each. A donation can be included on the order form or you can add the donation \$'s at the time of payment by e-Transfer.

Choose: CHECK OUT when you have completed your order.

Shipping information: Fill in your personal name and address of where you would like the order shipped. Include your phone # in this area if you can for additional reference.

Choose: CONTINUE TO SHIPPING

Shipping method: Choose Pick up at Store OR Canada Post Expedited if you are having the parcel mailed.

Choose: CONTINUE TO PAYMENT

Select **Pay at Store** (if you are going to send an e-Transfer to the store for the order amount)

<u>Note</u>: the full amount of the order including the shipping charge.

Choose: COMPLETE ORDER

To Pay: Close out of Shopify and log into your online banking in order to send an e-Transfer for payment.

eTransfers can be sent to order@al-anonbookstore.ca

In the message section of the e-Transfer you can include the name on the order or any other details the store may need to record your payment properly.

(eg. Literature order for ODAT + \$100 donation)

Thank you for paying for orders by this method thereby reducing the service fees our LDC pays.

Help Keep Literature Prices Low!

Did you know that the Al-Anon Bookstore (Alberta/N.W.T.) relies on donations to keep the price of our books as low as possible for members?

World events are affecting so many areas of our lives, and the bookstore is no exception. As you can imagine, when many Al-Anon groups did not meet in person over the last couple years, group orders declined. The bookstore continued throughout to take orders online and by phone (with shipping or curbside pickup), but could not open for in-store shopping until recently, or deliver orders at Area Assemblies. In addition, the ability to download digital copies of some Al-Anon literature (CAL) now offers more alternatives which may also reduce sales of printed books.

Fortunately, individuals continued to place orders and more groups are now meeting in-person again. Sometimes members order directly from the WSO in Virginia Beach, USA, however they often pay more for their order once shipping and the CDN/US exchange



rates are added in because by ordering in bulk our Al-Anon Bookstore obtains a better price on shipping. Others who shop online may also find used books available via online bookstores and auctions, however this can be a costly choice for the consumer. Often these used books are priced much higher than those purchased new from our Al-Anon Bookstore! For example, a recent comparison (May 2022) showed "Reaching For Personal Freedom" priced at \$34.59 plus shipping/import fees through another outlet, while offered through our Al-Anon Bookstore for \$22.00 plus shipping (or via curbside pickup).

This comparison shows how our Al-Anon Bookstore strives to keep prices reasonable so members can afford the important CAL they want and need. As a result it does not operate like a commercial bookstore, but rather as a Literature Distribution Centre (LDC) and relies on donations and revenue to help pay costs such as wages and rent.

Al-Anon is self supporting, and making literature readily available is one aspect of the service it offers. So when your group donates, please remember that gifts to the Al-Anon Bookstore generously help members in Alberta/ N.W.T. continue to buy our valuable Al-Anon books at reasonable prices.

Removing My Rose-Tinted Glasses

When I broke up with my first boyfriend after five years together, my mother arrived to move me back home. On our 12-hour drive, we would go hours at a time not speaking as I silently cried. Once, when she punctured the silence to ask if I'd remembered to pack a towel in my travel bag, I realized I felt more alone and invisible in the car with her than I had at any point in my breakup.

As soon as we got back to my hometown, I looked up my first Al-Anon meeting. I knew my mother had been an alcoholic, but A.A. had "fixed" her, and she'd stopped going to meetings before I was even born, so I worried I wouldn't qualify to attend Al-Anon. However, I was welcomed by everyone as soon as I arrived. After a lifetime with a mother who tried to show her support by "doing" things for me, it was an amazing relief to find a fellowship who didn't do anything for me, but instead sat back calmly as they listened, acknowledged, and accepted my feelings.

At that same meeting, two weeks later, a member began talking about hiding alcohol from a partner. This triggered the memory of how, during my relationship, I could only keep a miniature bottle of cooking wine in the refrigerator—a quantity too small for my partner to get drunk on. When I bought the tiny bottles of cooking wine, I would hide all but one in my underwear drawer so that my partner would not find and drink them. All of a sudden, a thousand miles away and a month after the breakup, I realized I had spent the past five years of my life with an alcoholic!

This revelation gave immediate credence to the sharings and readings about alcoholic family patterns and inspired metofindaSponsorrightaway, worktheSteps, and develop an understanding of how my dry-but-still-dysfunctional family had shaped my ideas about relationships and my perception of my own emotional needs.

Several years later, I still struggle to communicate and connect emotionally with my mother, but I'm working my program alongside my fiancé, who has ten years of sobriety under his belt and a commitment to growth that supports and inspires mine. Al-Anon has removed the rose-tinted glasses of denial and helped me to see myself, my life, and my loved ones for who we are instead of who I think we should be.
