

My first home group of about seven, met in a small basement of a tiny, small-town church. I was there because I was so broken from living with alcoholism; I heard words for the first time that reflected my feelings and experiences.

I began working on my Steps with three other new members. I was trying to wrap my head around alcoholism being a disease when it all felt so incredibly personal and painful and hopeless. I certainly did not know what a Group Rep or District Rep was or did; nor that I belonged in a specific District of an Area that encompassed Alberta, the North West Territories and locations in S.E.

British Columbia. I never considered that my little group could have a vote about who would represent us as our Delegate during a thing called World Service Conference. Even more incredible was that we belonged to a world-wide organization with a World Service Office!

While reflecting on our recent Alberta/N.W.T. Area Spring Assembly, I thought back to attending as a new GR. From those earliest of days through to having the honour of being your Chairperson, it truly has happened One Day at a Time (early days sometimes hanging on a moment at a time). Consistent attendance at a home group, a trusted personal sponsor and later adding a Service Sponsor; Al-Anon book studies and people in service who became dear friends have been my supports on this life journey.

It was thrilling to have 29 new attendees at Spring Assembly! It was a very full day with everyone listening, discussing and making decisions. Thank you for your hard work. We have undertaken a lot in our first five months of our three-year term. It is only possible because of the service of everyone in our Area. I look forward to getting to know you and hearing about your service journey that led you to Assembly.

Happiness Is My Choice

I started AlAnon in my 30s. I'm now in my 70s. My perceptions of my alcoholic loved one have changed. I used to blame him for everything. If I was in a bad mood, it was because of him. I was sure he made me feel irritable and unreasonable. Then it dawned on me why I was feeling so angry at him: I wanted him to fulfill my every dream in life. How selfish of me, expecting this man to give me the world.

In AlAnon I learned not to expect others to make me happy. I was encouraged to start loving myself first. I needed to take care of myself and not expect others to bring me joy. I started doing what made me happy. If I decided to do crafts, then I would do it. If I wanted to do a yoga class, then I'd do it. It was my choice. Taking care of myself is my top priority. No one can make me happy, lonely, angry, or depressed. It is *my* choice if I want to feel these emotions.

My husband and I began having a better relationship once I came to believe that I was the one responsible for my happiness. I'm thankful I became a member of AlAnon and that I stayed with this program that is working on me. We are much happier since AlAnon is a part of my life.

Conference Approved Literature (CAL)

I am here to bring you some news from our World Service Office (WSO) about our wonderful **Conference Approved Literature (CAL)** and the **Forum**. The most recent booklet that has come out is on the topic of *Healing Within Our Alcoholic Relationships*. You may all have seen this new item already. It has questions on all of our Three Legacies, Steps, Traditions and Concepts. The questions on each of these legacies are so pertinent for our recovery.

Our WSO is asking for sharings now for two new pieces of literature. One is on *Your Relationship with Finances in Al-Anon Recovery* and the other is *Sponsorship and Service Sponsorship*.

If you feel the urge to write to either of these topics, please do so. There are writing Guidelines for both of them at al-anon.org/sharing. The Guidelines have questions and ideas that could help you get writing.

You may be interested in reading about the process for developing a new piece of Conference Approved Literature.

The Process for Developing Conference Approved Literature (CAL)

Al-Anon's Conference Approved Literature originates with an idea, which can come from any Al-Anon member, group, or service arm. The Conference gives conceptual approval to ideas that meet the needs of the fellowship in a way not already covered in existing literature. After Conference approval, the WSO requests personal sharings from members around the world. The Literature Committee and WSO Staff coordinate the piece's development. Through this process, the literature reflects the views of our fellowship without being limited to one person's thoughts or ideas. Drafts are reviewed by the Literature Committee and members of the Policy Committee to assure they adhere to Al-Anon principles, policies, and Traditions. This process provides a series of "checks and balances" to the creation of our literature. The Conference does not evaluate or give approval to any literature produced outside of this process. (Taken from G-6)

Now for the Forum: it is a wonderful way to read sharings from people all over USA and Canada. It used to be referred to as "A Meeting in Your Pocket", and it really is!

Editors are always looking for new submissions to the Forum.

You can also send pictures of nature or wildlife. What they really like of pictures of members (their backs of course) looking at all the CAL in their meeting rooms. The Forum is also available digitally if that works better for you.

Q & A: Newcomer Online Sessions - You Had Questions, We Have Answers

Q: What are these sessions, and when are they held?

- A:
- The purpose of a Newcomer Online Session is similar to that of Telephone Answering Services, only it is offered online instead of by phone.
 - Volunteers answer inquiries about Al-Anon and help people find meetings.
 - It is offered each Saturday from 11am to Noon.

Q: Is it held on Zoom?

A: It is currently held on Jitsi, an online platform similar to Zoom.

Q: How do people find it, where is the link?

A: The link along with more information is on the area web page in the 3rd paragraph at: <https://al-anon.ab.ca>

Q: Is it like an online meeting for newcomers?

A: No, it is not a meeting. The Session is for people looking for information about the Al-Anon program. The main focus is to direct them to meetings. Any Al-Anon member is also welcome to drop in to a session to check it out.

Q: Who can volunteer?

A: AFG members who are familiar with the Al-Anon program and willing to share their experience, strength and hope. It's a Step 12 service opportunity to carry the message to others.

Q: What does volunteering for this involve?

A: Volunteers commit to stay online for one hour from 11am to Noon, to answer questions from visitors. They are available online for 1 hour.

Q: Can AFG Groups volunteer, or only individual members?

A: An AFG group may volunteer to cover a session (or more) and find members from their group to cover it. Al-Anon members may also sign up as individuals to volunteer.

Q: How many newcomers typically show up each week?

A: The number of visitors from week to week may vary. Nevertheless, as the Al-Anon Declaration says "When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help let the hand of Al-Anon and Alateen always be there..."

Q: Are there guidelines for volunteers about how to lead a Newcomer Online Session?

A: Guidelines specifically for these sessions will be available, and will be similar to guidelines for Telephone Answering Services.

Q & A: Newcomer Online Sessions - You Had Questions, We Have Answers

Q: How many weeks can volunteers sign up for?

A: You or your group may sign up for 1 or more weeks.

Q: How do we sign up to volunteer?

A: Please contact the Area Public Outreach Coordinator with the dates you would like: public_outreach@al-anon.ab.ca or text Ric at **1-403-550-1050**.

Q: How do I know what week I am scheduled, is there a list to look it up?

A: Starting in April 2025, when people volunteer for a date it will be listed on the Area Events Calendar at <https://al-anon.ab.ca/events> which is updated on Saturdays. Then volunteers can check which dates are still available, and which dates are taken. First names with last initial only or group names will be shown to protect anonymity. Please specify if you wish to be identified differently on the calendar.

Q: Who do we contact if we need a replacement to cover our scheduled session?

A: Individuals or groups that need to reschedule can contact the Public Outreach Coordinator. Groups can choose a replacement from their available members.

Q: How long will these online sessions be offered?

A: The Newcomer Online Sessions will be ongoing for as long as they are needed and volunteers are available.

“Our Common Welfare”—Notes from the WSO

Carrying the AI-Anon Message Online

Whether we use social media to connect with friends and family or follow our favorite interests, it has become a large part of our lives. Social media is one way we can carry the AIAnon message, but it can be tricky.

The Social Media Policy found in the Public Outreach section of the “Digest of AI-Anon and Alateen Policies” in the *AIAnon/Alateen Service Manual* (P-24/27) provides guidance about using social media to spread our message of help and hope to those suffering as a result another person’s alcoholism.

The Policy provides carefully defined service authority, such as who can create AI-Anon or Alateen social media pages/profiles and what roles groups and members can take on, so that each member and service arm can understand the role they play in using this avenue for carrying the message.

While sharing the message of help and hope to families and friends of alcoholics on social media, members are encouraged to practice obedience to the unenforceable by adhering to AIAnon Traditions. Tradition Eleven states, in part, “Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films, and TV.”

This applies to our online presence as well, as does Tradition Twelve, which states, “Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles above personalities.”
